ABOUT

Camp HOPE America is the first evidence-based camping and mentoring program in the United States to focus on children and teens exposed to domestic violence.

Children who are exposed to trauma such as domestic violence are more likely to experience health, social, and legal disparities as adults. The mission is to give traumatized youth a brighter future by creating pathways to hope and healing. The program consists of a week of overnight camp supported by yearlong activities and group mentorship referred to as Pathways.

Camp Hope is a weeklong overnight camping adventure for children. While at camp, youth explore high adventure activities that help them overcome fears and try new things in a safe, supportive setting. Youth participate in collaborative, team-building activities and learn what it means to believe in themselves, each other, and their dreams.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who is eligible to be a camper?

- Youth ages 7 to 17.
- Experienced trauma (DV, child and/or sex abuse).
- Receiving services from an affiliate organization or partner agency.
- Three months out of immediate danger.
- Does not exhibit violence behaviors.
- Can not be court mandated.

How much does it cost?

There is no cost for families to participate in Camp HOPE with the help of generous donors and supporters.
